Re: First Reconciliation and First Communion

Dear parents and guardians:

For those preparing to receive the First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion, St. James Parish is pleased to offer the choice to do sacramental prep either in-person or online.

For candidates electing to do in-person sacramental prep, classes will take place on Saturday mornings from 9:30 am to 11:30 am on the following dates: March 25; April 1, 15, 22 and 29; and May 6, 2023. Classes will be held at St. James School (7332 St. James Lane, Tottenham), instead of the parish itself.

Attached to this correspondence, please find a list of Frequently Asked Questions ("FAQ"), a First Communion Registration Form and a Parish Registration Form. The FAQ will explain the entire process with regards to registration and sacramental prep.

Here are the available dates for First Reconciliation:

- (a) Fri. May 12, 2023 at 7:30 pm Father F.X. O'Reilly;
- (b) Fri. May 19, 2023 at 7:30 pm Msgr. Ronan; and
- (c) Fri. May 26, 2023 at 7:30 pm St. James School.

Please note that First Reconciliation will begin at 7:30 pm as listed above because we have evening Masses on those dates which begin at 7 pm.

Here are the available dates for First Communion:

- (a) Sat. May 27, 2023 at 10:30 am Father F.X. O'Reilly;
- (b) Sat. June 3, 2023 at 10:30 am Msgr. Ronan; and
- (c) Sat. June 10, 2023 at 10:30 am St. James School.

Both First Reconciliation and First Communion will be held at St. James Parish.

The registration deadline is Fri. Feb. 3, 2023.

First Reconciliation and First Communion - Frequently Asked Questions

What are the dates for First Reconciliation and First Communion?

Here are the available dates for First Reconciliation:

- (d) Fri. May 12, 2023 at 7:30 pm Father F.X. O'Reilly;
- (e) Fri. May 19, 2023 at 7:30 pm Msgr. Ronan; and
- (f) Fri. May 26, 2023 at 7:30 pm St. James School.

Please note that First Reconciliation will begin at 7:30 pm as listed above because we have evening Masses on those dates which begin at 7 pm.

Here are the available dates for First Communion to coincide with the regularly scheduled 10:30 am Mass at St. James Parish:

- (d) Sat. May 27, 2023 at 10:30 am Father F.X. O'Reilly;
- (e) Sat. June 3, 2023 at 10:30 am Msgr. Ronan; and
- (f) Sat. June 10, 2023 at 10:30 am St. James School.

Both First Reconciliation and First Communion will be held at St. James Parish.

What if I would prefer to attend another date for First Reconciliation and/or First Communion?

For those wishing to receive First Reconciliation and/or First Communion with their classmates, please note which school corresponds to the dates noted earlier. That said, candidates are free to be confirmed at whichever date is most convenient for them and their families.

Candidates who attend schools other than Msgr. Ronan, St. James and F.X. O'Reilly are welcome to attend any date for First Reconciliation and/or First Communion.

How do I register for First Reconciliation and First Communion?

To register for First Reconciliation and First Communion, please do the following:

- (a) complete either the in-person or online sacramental prep program (see later);
- (b) submit the First Communion Registration Form to the parish office;
- (c) submit a copy of the candidate's baptismal certificate;
- (d) submit a Parish Registration Form, if necessary (see later); and
- (e) pay the registration fee (see later).

If you were baptized at St. James, St. Mary's or St. Francis Xavier, please advise the parish office as to when approximately you were baptized to assist us in looking up your information in our parish records.

How will sacramental prep be done this year?

This year, we are offering two options to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Communion. Please indicate on the First Communion Registration Form which sacramental prep program you wish to choose.

(a) OPTION #1: IN-PERSON CLASSES

If you elect for in-person classes, the course will consist of six sessions which will be held at St. James School (7332 St. James Lane, Tottenham) on Saturday mornings from 9:30 am to 11:30 am on the following dates: Mar. 25; Apr. 1, 15, 22 and 29; and May 6, 2023. Candidates must attend all six sessions in this case.

(b) OPTION #2: ONLINE CLASSES

Instead of the in-person classes, candidates can choose an online program called "The Way" offered by HopeStone which consists of six videos: each of which is approximately 20 to 30 minutes long. Candidates will have to finish each pre-recorded video before moving onto the next session.

How do I register for the online course?

Once you let the parish office know that you are opting for the online course (by submitting the First Communion Registration Form indicating that you are choosing the online option), the parish office will provide HopeStone will your email so they can set up an account for you.

You will receive an email (check your junk box) with a prompt to click a link and set up your password. Please contact the parish office if you don't receive an email link from HopeStone in a timely manner following your submission of the registration materials to the parish office.

When you login, you will see "The Way" Program! Once you have set up your password, you can login simply by clicking this link: <u>virtual.hopestone.ca.</u>

After logging in click the "Program" icon, which will make the sacramental prep

After logging in, click the "Program" icon, which will make the sacramental prep program accessible. The program is designed that children cannot move through to the next session until they have completed the first program. Videos cannot be skipped or fast-forwarded. The first three sessions cover First Reconciliation, and the following three sessions will cover First Communion.

What if I miss one of the in-person sessions for sacramental prep?

If you are unable to attend a particular session, please inform the person teaching the course to arrange for the material to be made up in some way.

What is the registration fee?

The registration fee is \$25, regardless of whether you register for the in-person or online classes.

What is the registration deadline?

The registration deadline is Fri. Feb. 3, 2023.

How do I pay the registration fee?

Payments to the parish office may be made via cash or cheques payable to "St. James Parish." Unfortunately, there is no option to pay the parish online or via credit card.

You can leave the money or cheque in a sealed envelope with your full name and what it is for in the drop box located on the side of the parish office at St. James. You can also drop off your payment in person during office hours (Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 2 pm to 5 pm).

If you cannot afford the registration fee, please contact the parish office.

How should I assist my child in preparing for First Reconciliation?

Besides the preparation that will take place through the online prep course, please review with your child the attached "Examination of Conscience" and "Going to Confession: Step-by-Step" handouts.

If our family regularly attends another parish besides St. James, St. Mary's or St. Francis Xavier, can my child still receive the sacraments here?

Yes. You only need to complete a Parish Registration Form and return it to the parish office. You will not need a letter of permission from the parish that you attend.

There is no need to complete the Parish Registration Form if St. James, St. Mary's or St. Francis Xavier is your closest parish.

If I don't attend any of the elementary schools attached to the parish, can I still receive the sacraments at the parish?

Yes. However, if St. James, St. Mary's or St. Francis Xavier is not your closest parish, you will need to complete a Parish Registration Form.

Is there a limit to the number of people who can attend the First Reconciliation and First Communion ceremonies?

There is no limit to the number of attendees you can bring.

Will there be reserved seating?

There will be designated seating only for First Communion candidates and their parents.

How will my child come up for First Communion?

When it is time to receive Holy Communion, the priest will ask the candidates and their parents to come up together to receive Communion before the rest of the congregation.

What should my child wear to their First Communion?

There is no set requirement for a specific dress code.

Bless me Father, for I have sinned. This is my First Confession and here are my sins.

Confess your sins to the priest.

After confessing your sins, you can say:

For these and all my sins, I am truly sorry.

The priest may give you some advice. He will then give you something for penance, and then ask you to make the Act of Contrition.

ACT OF CONTRITION

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.

I have sinned against You whom I should love.

I intend, with the help of Your grace, to do penance, and to sin no more and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.

Amen.

The priest will then give you absolution for the forgiveness of your sins.

The priest may then mention that you can go by saying: Go in peace.

Response: Thanks be to God.

You may then go outside of the confessional and do the penance that was given.
